How wonderful it is to see **winter sport** up and running. It is fantastic to witness parents and whanau supporting our students at sports fixtures. We encourage all WCC students to 'awhi' and support each other, to be kind, and to always display fair play attributes. Currently, it is very difficult to get coaches, referees, and administrators for several sports codes, please remember those who officiate games are usually volunteers. Practice exams provide an opportunity for students to practise skills required in internal and external exams. Participating in practice exams allows students to develop confidence and become familiar with the way external exams are conducted therefore helping to reduce anxiety. Doing practice exams helps students and teachers to determine what topics and what areas you need to concentrate on. Completing a practice exam gives students a sense of the layout, question style and overall expectations of the 'real exams.'

Our school value "Hirangatanga" reminds us to strive for excellence. Displaying Hirangatanga is important when facing schoolwork and exams (whether they be practice or real). Hirangatanga is about effort and application, and the desire to make a positive difference. The Te Reo word "Hira" can be translated to mean be great, important, of consequence, significant, notable, momentous. We encourage all students from year 7 through to year 13 to do their best, to set personal goals and to value their learning. When we strive for excellence, we are trying to continuously improve. This doesn't mean undertaking a seismic shift, but rather constant striving which means that small changes accumulate to make a significant impact! Our teachers are here to support their learners to do their best and equip them with knowledge and understanding. As students mature, they must see that the responsibility for learning lies with them. The role of teachers is to shape students who are not dependent on teachers, but rather grow their capacity for resourcefulness and self-direction. It is true of all of us, that we do learn all our lives, but we will have a teacher for only a fraction of that time! Make the most of your time at school and the time you have with your teachers.



William Colenso College has its own school app which can be downloaded to your apple or android cellphone (device) -

"On your Apple or Android cellphone (device) please search for "School Apps NZ" and install the app with that name. Once installed please open the App and search for "William Colenso College" to get connected.

This will allow the school staff to send out to those who have downloaded the app, alerts about various activities: sports events, homework reminders etc.

Other functions that are available in the app are:

- absentee tab: to advise when your child will be absent from school
- events tab: will give calendar dates for the school year
- contacts tab: able to make contact via phone or email with a staff member
- Notices: the daily school notices that are available to staff and students about events happening that day in school.
