Vaping is a life altering choice that can last their entire life. Once a student starts vaping it is very very hard for them to quit. It will take nicotine gum, patches, therapy, and much more for them to quit. "It's easier to prevent a forest fire than it is to put one out!"

Attendance: In Aotearoa New Zealand, learners are expected to attend school every day the school is open – yet many don't. Our attendance levels are worse than in other comparable countries and are continuing to fall. In 2022, secondary school regular attendance fell to 37 percent. This is concerning, because the evidence is clear that regular attendance is important for learning, wellbeing, and life outcomes. This is not an issue that schools can tackle alone, we need our whanau support. Regular school attendance makes a big difference. Everyday counts, and we know that missing too many days leads to lower achievement, poorer wellbeing, and other worrying outcomes. We are mindful of the array of reasons why students don't attend school, and we will continue to work with whanau around these concerns. Please encourage your student to come to school. Call us if support is required.

2025 ENROLMENTS


