**CELLPHONES:** As you are aware, the new government initiative of 'phones away for the day' is set to come into effect from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2024. We are asking for parental / caregiver assistance with the new guidelines.

**How can parents & caregivers help?** If you require your student(s) to bring their phone to school, please remind them the phone must be kept in their bags. This also includes Ear pods and other listening devices. We are aware that many parents like to stay in touch with their child by texting during the school day. A friendly reminder that School is a place for focusing on learning. Every time focus is interrupted, it takes a lot of brain power and energy to get back on task. When a phone vibrates in a pocket, the focus moves from what the student was learning to what is happening in their pocket, they wonder what the notification is. When they are asked a question, they haven't heard a word the teacher has said because their brain is elsewhere. Please note, you can still contact your child if you have a change in plans or a family emergency: please contact the front office. If the message is not urgent it can probably wait.

**ATTENDANCE:** Another area where parents / caregivers can assist us is in supporting your child to be successful in school by making school attendance a priority for your child / children. Parents and caregivers have a legal duty to ensure children get a full-time education. Being at school and in class is important and a requirement to learning.

Developing good habits while at school will be beneficial to students long after they have completed secondary school. To develop good habits, students should be encouraged to:

- have a regular bedtime that allows for a good nights sleep
- organise their lives by leaving early enough in the morning to get to school on time
- turn off electronic devices one hour before bedtime

- attend classes on time.

Helping students to build responsibility skills is an important life lesson and will set them up to make the most of the opportunities that come their way. Being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for students to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to extra-curricular opportunities and pastoral care.

What is the school doing to improve school attendance? In addition to our attendance team, we have individual form teachers monitoring daily attendance. A fortnightly session between form teachers and deans has been added to our meeting schedule to review attendance concerns. We use attendance data to analyze attendance and target the reasons behind poor attendance. We also have support from attendance services who make visits to the homes of students who are not attending school. We hope these measures will aim to improve attendance, leading to better attainment and mental wellbeing amongst our students. In most cases, if your child's attendance level is falling, we will contact you to explore the reasons and discuss what help can be put in place. You can expect the school to meet with you to discuss our concerns. If the barriers to your child's attendance are in school, the school would like to work with you to help overcome the issues.

School photos were taken on Thursday 14th March for all students who were present at school on this day.


