Our school houses are named after some of the mountain peaks that surround Hawke's Bay - Waikamaka, Maropea, Tupari and Remutupo. Each house has a colour. Mine is Waikamaka - the yellow house, and we won this event. Students were very excited.

Rotorua Trip

We had a wonderful trip to Rotorua. The trip took in the Skyline Gondola, Waikite Valley Hot Pools and Thermal area, Canopy tours - this involved ziplining through pristine native forest with 1000 year old trees, Huka Falls, Aratiatia Rapids, Te Puia cultural experience and Wingspan, where native birds of prey are nursed back to health and trained to be able to return to the bush.


